







The Door is turning 30!

As of this year, The Door is celebrating its 30-year anniversary! This is a significant achievement, and we would want to express our gratitude to the youths, staff, volunteers, placement students, board members, and alumni who have contributed significantly to the development of the center over the years. **STAY TUNED** for exciting details on our upcoming 30th-anniversary bash!".

This is the first door. It was Art Stinson, who had previously served as the head of the School of Social Work at Carleton University, who had the opinion that there was a requirement to provide a location where young people could engage with one another, make new friends, and gain access to various services. The Door was created in May of 1994 as a result of this idea, which led to its opening.

Since then, the center has experienced its fair share of highs and lows, particularly during the Covid-19 period, during which the center was temporarily shut down due to restrictions. Despite these challenges, The Door has persevered and has once again managed to keep its youth members who were already associated with it. Today, The Door is more powerful than it has ever been, and it is looking forward to a positive future for another 30 years.


Bittersweet Departure & Welcoming Return
















We recognize and thank the Ottawa Food Bank for its years of assistance and for providing us with the food to make many of Najwa's delicious meals!






Overall, August at The Door was filled with diverse activities and joyful moments, wrapping up the summer with a perfect blend of learning, fun, and community connection.

Empowering Change: The Door Youth Centre's Black Youth Leadership Program

The Door Youth Centre proudly received the Power of Youth grant from the Michaëlle Jean Foundation, which supports projects promoting racial equity and community change. The grant funded the Centre's Black Youth Leadership Program, running from October 2023 to September 2024, empowering young Black Canadians to lead change through activities such as exploring the Halifax Declaration, creating a podcast, a photovoice project, a cookbook on Black culinary traditions, and sewing workshops.

discussed critical issues such as food insecurity, community building, and their powerful collaboration with The Door Youth Centre.
















Teacher Career Day with Chari Rick Desclouds : A Legacy of Education and Community Impact
